Rules for Allocation of Kirkstall Harriers London Marathon Club Places

- 1. The member shall provide sufficient evidence (letter or email addressed to themselves) that they have entered the London Marathon that year and been rejected through the ballot system and this will be considered as their application for a club place.
- 2. The committee will ensure members are given at least two weeks' notice of the closing date to submit their evidence of rejection. This will include an email out to all members, as well as the Facebook page and notices at training. This will be done shortly after the ballot has been drawn. The closing date for applications will be strictly enforced. Verbal applications are NOT sufficient.
- 3. The following criteria are in order of priority, at the committee's discretion:
- The member should have been a paid-up member for at least 12 months from the closing date for applications for club places
- Has the member had a club place within the last 10 years?
- Have they run the London Marathon before?
- Dedication to the club
- Length of membership
- Participation in club events
- 4. Where there are more club places than members who have been rejected from the ballot, club places will be made available to ALL members and a new deadline for applications set. The above criteria will still be used.
- 5. Committee decision is final.
